Vedanthangal. The dark wanderer, common in TN's rural areas, has a lifespan of about a couple of months, while the blue banded Pierrot has a shorter life. said Ra. masami S R K, an enthusiast from Saptur in Madurai district.

This is the migratory season for butterflies which are drawn to fresh flowering plants in the Western Ghats that have bloomed during the monsoon, Ramasami said.

The migration of these tiny winged insects lasts days at a stretch, fast on sunny days and slower on cloudy days. On sunny days, it starts early as 7 in the morning and goes on without a break for many

A classic example is the migration of Crimson rose, a large butterfly species whose members travel from Tamil Nadu to Sri Lanka through the Palk Strait, covering several hundred kilometres. By the time they start the return trip, most are exhausted and drop dead. "One can see a large number of such butterflies dead on the Pamban railway bridge," Ramasami said.

There are a few butterfly species that migrate up to Odisha, beginning their journey from the Western Ghats in Kerala. They then fly over Western Ghats in TN, Sirumalai in Dindigul district, Kolli, Tiruvannamalai and Chennai before flying through the Tirupati hills to reach Odisha, he said.


