- 1. What is Chitrasutra? List the six limbs of painting as cited in Vatsyayana's Kamasutra.
- 2. With any one example, explain how the Chola murals are rich in detail, with paintings offering much historical information.
- 3. How is *Green Tara* a noteworthy example of style and technique used by artists of the Sumtsek region?
- 4. Using *Rasa Leela* as a reference, enumerate how the wall paintings of Badal Mahal in Bundi Fort appear to be Rajasthani but with Mughal and Deccani influence.
- 5. Ragamala paintings are the most striking and moving examples of sixteenth century Deccani Miniatures. Elaborate with any one significant work.
- 6. Though Bundi artists acquired the style from Islamic masters, they chose Hindu literary & mythological themes. Comment with a relevant example.

- 7. In the mature phase of Ajanta murals, pictorial space expands as a continuous web, with the entire story seen as single unified vision showing compositional skill. Discuss with any two relevant examples.
- 8. A commonality of style that is ethnic and geographically rooted is evident in the Kerala murals. Analyse with two appropriate works.

- 9. Compare the Mughal miniatures *Akbar Restraining Hawai* and *Jehangir's Dream* drawing out the similarities and variations.
- 10. Pahari Schools of Painting reflect the simplicity of Basohli to poetic lyricism and refinement of Kangra. Justify with any two select examples from the Basholi and Kangra region respectively.
