- 4. Consider Theodore Géricault's *Raft of the Medusa* with its drama, visual complexity, and emotional force, as a representation of its time.
- 5. Discuss how Salvador Dali expressed the concept of Surrealism in *Persistence of Memory*.
- 6. List the contrasting ideas that characterise Modernism and Postmodernism.
