- A. While rules for the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) are yet to be framed, government data shows that a significant majority of those granted Indian citizenship since 2018 were minorities from Pakistan, Afghanistan and Bangladesh. According to data provided by the government in Parliament, 8,244 people from Hindu, Sikh, Jain and Christian faiths from the three neighbouring countries had applied for Indian citizenship during the period. Out of these, citizenship was granted to 3,117 people till December this year.
- B. The Union Health Ministry has written to States to impose restrictions such as night curfews and declare containment zones if districts either have a 10% positivity rate or occupancy in oxygen-supported or Intensive Care Units rises to 40%.
- C. In its retail business survey, RAI said growth witnessed last month was 16% over the same period last year. Stating that retail businesses across regions had indicated growth in sales compared with pre-pandemic levels, RAI said West India signaled an 11% increase, followed by East and South at 9% while North India indicated a growth of 6% compared with sales levels in November 2019.
- D. A half-dozen SHoP employees said they worked about 50 hours a week on average, and often 60 to 70 hours when a key deadline loomed, usually every month or two. They said this was common even among more junior architects and designers who make \$50,000 to \$80,000 a year above what many in other fields make, but a strain for workers who typically accumulate tens of thousands of dollars in student debt.
- E. The Italy winger drilled a shot into the far corner in the 83rd minute to celebrate his first league goal since July 26 2020, a run of 513 days. It came after Moise Kean headed home the opener in the first half to set Juve on course for a victory that extends second-bottom Cagliari's winless league run to 11 matches.

An explosion took place on Thursday at the district court complex in Punjab's Ludhiana, in which at least two people are feared dead and several others injured. An official confirmation is yet to come as it is a developing story. According to Yogesh Dewan, who was present in the court, a loud sound was heard at around 12.15 p.m. in the court complex, after which people were seen running around in panic. "I heard a loud noise. The intensity of the blast was such that almost all the window panes of the first floor, where I was present, were shattered. The blast reportedly took place on the second floor of the building. Hundreds of litigants and advocates were present in the court for routine work. I saw at least one person injured, who was being taken away by the police personnel," Mr. Dewan told The Hindu.

A NASA spacecraft has officially "touched" the sun, plunging through the unexplored solar atmosphere known as the corona.
