- 2. Critically examine instances of adherence to the traditional gender roles, and behaviours that are visibly against such norms in *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.
- 3. Explain the use and significance of period costumes and the blending of styles in *Henry V* directed by Laurence Olivier.
- 4. Comment on the portrayal of an ideal marriage in the sonnet "Let me not to the marriage of true minds".
- 5. How do Branagh and Olivier use the flashback to interpret Falstaff's role in *Henry V*?
- 6. Analyse the seasonal imagery used in "Shall I compare thee to a summer's day".

- 9. How does Shakespeare present the morality of Henry's decision to go to war and his other political actions in *Henry V*? Discuss.
- 10. Compare and contrast Kenneth Branagh's and Laurence Olivier's directorial vision in their film adaptations of *Henry V*.
- 11. "Critics faced with the daunting interpretative task of Shakespeare's sonnets have often resorted to speculation about the poet's relations with the 'young man' of the first sequence, or the ethics of his addresses to the promiscuous 'dark lady.' Comment on the above view, and discuss the key thematic directions in Shakespeare's sonnets, with reference to the sonnets prescribed for study.
