1. a) Discuss the political history of the People's Republic of China, tracing its origins from Imperial China to the establishment and consolidation of the Communist regime.

- 2. a) Critically examine the structure and functioning of the Chinese political system, highlighting the roles of the Chinese Communist Party, the National People's Congress, and the People's Liberation Army.
