The table below reflects the preferences of children who watch different types of TV programmes, as found by a survey of a residential neighbourhood in which all the children participated.

The number in each cell represents the number of children who prefer different types of programmes. Row 1, Column 2 = 525 means that there are 525 children whose first preference is cartoons and the second preference is Sports.

(a) Read the following report and write an essay on the ongoing politically crisis in Pakistan.

Two near simultaneous suicide attacks ripped through Lahore on Tuesday morning, killing 24 people and wounding 170.

The incidents have deepened anxiety about the enormity of the security challenge to Pakistan and its new government that is still in the making.

Ending speculation of when he would convene the newly elected national Assembly to pave way for government formation, President Musharraf announced that he had set the first session for March 17. He said, during a convocation address, that the two most important challenges facing the new government were terrorism and economic development.

Tuesday's first suicide attack took place around 9:15 a.m. at the seven storeyed Punjab headquarters of the Federal Investigation Agency off the main Mall Road in Lahore.

The second blast took place minutes later at the other end of Lahore, in the Model Town residential area, where two men drove an explosive-laden car into a house rented by an advertising agency and set it off.

Angered by the attacks, people in some parts of the city took to the streets raising slogans against President Musharraf.

The police, relying on the first autopsy report, had declared the case as death by drowning. They revived the investigations only after a doctors' panel recommended that the police investigate the death as 'homicidal'.

The family had accused the police of trying to hush up the case. Their suspicion of foul play was partially confirmed in the second autopsy conducted on Scarlett.
