- 1. Evaluate Simone de Beauvoir's contention that woman is the constructed 'other' of a universal self that is always invested with male norms. Illustrate with specific instances from her *Introduction: The Second Sex*.
- 2. Discuss the themes of freedom and confinement as elaborated by Virginia Woolf in *A Room of One's Own*.
- 3. Aesthetic androgyny represented no more than a means of flight to Woolf, a "myth that helped her evade confrontation with her own painful femaleness and enabled her to choke and repress her anger and ambition. Substantiate Showalter's perception of flight and androgyny.
- 4. *The Palace of Illusions* takes us back to a time that is half history, half myth, and wholly magical. Discuss each of these elements as found in the novel.
- 5. How does TorilMoi foreground the idea of Anglo-American Feminism vis-à-vis the French Feminist agenda?
- 6. bell hooks argues that women share "bonds of sisterhood" throughout both race and class lines. Elaborate.
