CULTURAL SECRETARY, SHIFT II – PRISITNA ANN LYNDA



YOUTH SKILLS PROGRAM

As part of its initiative, the Students' Union 2018-19 enforced the Youth Skills Program (YSP) for the academic year 2018-19. Similar to the Language Partnership Program (LPP) in college which reaches out to students in need of help with the English language, the Youth Skills Program aimed at reaching out to all students who wished to develop their skills in fields pertaining to performing arts, namely light music, western music, western dance, folk dance, classical dance and dramatics. This initiative was mainly to cater to the students who do not get selected into clubs and therefore, a platform for them to improve their skills.

The YSP comprised of 10 classes per semester, with each class being conducted for a duration of one hour (tentatively, 11:30am to 12:30pm for students of shift 2 and 1:30pm to 2:30pm for students of shift 1). The classes were conducted by student trainers who belonged to the specific clubs and a set of prescribed syllabi was followed during the course of the entire program. A nominal fee of Rs.100 was charged from each student who registered for the YSP in a bid to encourage all students to take part in it. Attendance was taken for all the classes and certificates was provided to the student learners only if she has attended a minimum of 8 classes with attendance of 85%. The student trainers and learners will receive their certificates for having completed the program on the same day.

ART CLUB

The Students' Union 2018-19 proposed the idea for the formation of a new club called the 'Art club' in college. The aim for the establishment of an Art Club in Stella Maris was to lead artists in college to come together and form a guild, to collaborate with each other's efforts, and to enhance their skills and to participate in intercollegiate events.

The following were the objectives of the club:

- 1. To help artists from across all departments to showcase their skills on unexplored platforms.
- 2. To encourage students from all departments to participate in art competitions within and outside college.
- 3. To collaborate with the Students' Union and the Event Management Club by providing creative and artistic assistance.

This initiative was appreciated, approved and forwarded to the incoming Students' Union 2019-2020 to officially introduce a new 'Art Club' on Stella Maris College campus.

CLUBS WEEK

As part of the initiative the Students' Union 2018-19 organized the "Clubs week" with each club as opposed to those involved in the Youth Skills Program getting a week's time to showcase their talents and skills by organizing various workshops, competitions and activities for students. 





• CLUBS WEEK







- Every event has a specific time allotment. Exceeding the time limit will result in a loss of 10 points.
- The participants are required to report to the event venue half an hour before their event, and re-register using their ID cards. The teams and/or participants who do not report on time will lose 10 points.
- Each student may participate in ONE on-stage event and TWO off-stage events.
- No vulgarity of any form will be entertained. Please follow the dress code prescribed in page 5 and 6 of the college Handbook.
- No external choreographer will be entertained.
- Scoring for on-stage events is as follows:

First place - 50

Second place - 40

Third place - 30

Scoring for off-stage events is as follows:

First place - 40

Second place - 30 Third Place - 20

- Groups are required to place a jackpot on ONE on-stage and ONE off-stage event. Winning a jackpot event earns the group 100 points and losing, results in a deduction of 50 points. The Representatives of each group are required to place the jackpots latest by the 1st of August, 2018.
- The groups are required to dress according to their team's colour.
- Each team will be assigned a zone that has to be kept clean.
 Failure of which will result in a loss of 50 points. Team colored dustbins will also be placed all around the campus.



FIRST STUDENT COUNCIL MEETING FOR THE SEMSTER ENDING OCTOBER 2018

FEEDBACK AND POINTS NOTED

STUDENTS' UNION AND LOGO

FEEDBACK: The logo of the students' union 2018-19 for this year is a finger snapping with the flame arising because of it. The idea of this logo is to instill in every student a sense of responsibility to achieve greater things. 4% of the student population rated the logo as excellent and highly relatable, 36% as very good and 43% as good. 'IGNITE' was rated by 4% of the population as excellent, 50% as very good and 32% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The response is highly encouraging for the union as it helps in us organizing more events in college.

FEEDBACK: Days which have been observed in college as break time events include, 'World suicide prevention day', 'friendship day', 'International Dogs day', 'International day for the prevention of drug abuse', 'Malala day etc. 25% of the students rated it as excellent, 39% as very good and 19% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The break times were seen to be highly successful and is an encouraging and motivating sign.

FEEDBACK: In terms of approachability, we were rated as excellent by 44% of the student population and 32% rated the Union as very good in terms of the same. The next question in the survey was on the adherence to the theme for the year 2018-19. 26% of the population believed that it was excellent and 28% of the population believed that it was very good.

POINTS NOTED: The representatives were told that suggestions pertaining to events along the theme of the year will be reconsidered and that the calendar of events for the upcoming semester would also reflect the same.

Independence Day and Stella Maris College birthday

FEEDBACK: The 72nd Independence Day along with Stella Maris college birthday celebrations were held in college on the 15th of August. The overall event was rated by 32% of the student population as excellent, 35% as very good and 24% as good. In terms of the participation from each class, 15% rated it as poor.

POINTS NOTED: The representatives during the meeting were suggested to speak to their classmates on the significance of the event and the importance in maximum participation. Every year, a cultural event is conducted towards the end of the event where students from across departments take part in it.

FEEDBACK: This year, students were asked to showcase the traditional dances of the various states in India. In the survey, 35% of the students rated this event as excellent, 18% as very good and 32% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestions which were addressed include increasing the time frame of preparation for the dance event and efficient grouping.

BANK

FEEDBACK: 4% of the students rated the bank as excellent,21% as very good and 25% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestions stated in the survey were to provide a new ATM as the current one wasn't place. The bank stated that a new ATM would be in place in less than a week.

LIBRARY

FEEDBACK: 14 % of the students rated the library as excellent, 43% as very good and 32% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestion stated was that library should be updated with new collection of books. Upon informing the library, students were asked to fill book requisition forms. If subject books were unavailable, students were asked to speak to their HOD about the same.

MTC

FEEDBACK: 3% of the student population believe that the service is excellent. 18% of the students rated very good and 29% rated it as good.

POINTS NOTED: Suggestions stated were, the slack in frequency of buses and availability of ladies' special buses. The MTC office has been intimated of the same.

VEHICLE PARKING

FEEDBACK: 11% of the students rated it as excellent, 21% as very good and 18% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestions stated were that vehicle charges were expensive and that an expansion of student vehicle parking was required. However, upon calculating the cost per day, it was seen to be minimal. Students were encouraged to park their vehicles responsibly.

WASHROOMS

FEEDBACK: 11% stated that the washrooms were in very good condition, 43% as good and 28% as poor.

POINTS NOTED: Suggestions stated were the need of newspapers, installation of pegs, peddle dustbins and that the cleanliness of washrooms had to be maintained. Students were encouraged to bring their own newspapers and dispose the sanitary napkins responsibly.

Club Activities - Student Council Meeting

FEEDBACK: The ratings for the club activities have improved since the previous year, with the initiative of the Students' Union of Clubs week and Youth Skills Programme. The activeness of the club has been rated by 59% students as good, and 17% students as very good. The effectiveness in circulating club related information has been rated by 39% of students as good and 13% students as very good. The satisfaction in how the auditions and elections were conducted has been rated as excellent by 15% of students, very good by 26% students and good by 29% students. The satisfaction in the method that the clubs adopted to conduct various events has been rated as very good by 16% of students and good by 48% of students.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestions and developments which the students' union wishes to enforce to make the club activities more effective include the Clubs Week initiative, Youth Skills Programme and the introduction of a new club called the Art Club. The Clubs week initiative which provides a platform for non-performing clubs to conduct various activities and competitions pertaining to their club, has already been put into effect and so far, the Photography club week, the Damini club week and the Stellaeidoscope week have been conducted. The Students' Union wishes to start with the YSP and Art Club the next semester. YSP will mainly aim at the performing clubs, where the office bearers or members of the club will conduct classes for the students at a

minimal fee and at the end a certificate will be awarded to them. The Art Club aims at providing a platform for all artists from across departments to showcase their skills and participate in various competitions and work in collaboration with the union.

FRESHERS' TALENT HUNT

FEEDBACK: The theme for the freshers was 'Just roll the dice'. The events conducted were themed around board games. 25 % of the student population believed that the theme was very good and 55 % stated that it was good. The events that were conducted were rated excellent by 6 % of the student population, 35% rated it as very good and 35% as good. Suggestions were made to add new events and have been taken into consideration. The volunteers for the events were rated as excellent by 7%. 7% believed that maximum participation was encouraged. 20% of the students rated it as very good and 40% rated it as good.

POINT NOTED: Suggestions were made to hold effective groupings, instead of the already prevalent ones and they will be taken into consideration for the next event. 10% of the students rated the auditions conducted for events as excellent. 27% of the students rated it as very good and 36% of the students as good. Overall the event was a grand success.

INFRASTRUCTURE:

FEEDBACK: The suggestions stated were that students find it difficult to use one arm chairs, projectors do not work in all classrooms, more tress need to be planted, dustbins to be kept near every block, classrooms to be cleaned regularly, provision of permanent classrooms for B.VOC students and B.VOC timings to be made convenient to facilitate student participation in programs.

POINTS NOTED: The solution for the above stated issues are that individual desks can't be provided as each desk requires more space, any complaints with regard to projectors to be submitted to Sr.Hilda and the classes are cleaned on

a daily basis. The dustbins available on campus are not utilized properly, hence students are encouraged to use the dustbins wisely. The B.VOC timings have been reported and all B.VOC students have permanent classrooms.

DTP:

FEEDBACK: 41% students rated it as very good, 26% as good and 22% as excellent. The suggestions were that expansion of the DTP is required and books are not taken for photocopying

POINTS NOTED:. The DTP stated that the DTP is always crowded and to expedite the process during exams, books are not taken for photocopying. The students are advised to have a check on their notes regularly.

CANTEEN:

FEEDBACK: 39% of the students rated it as very good, 21% as fair and 18% as excellent. The feedbacks stated that the food pricing is high, infrastructure and cleanliness to be maintained, cooking attire to be worn and sufficient number of dustbins to be provided.

POINTS NOTED: Upon informing the canteen, it was reported that the GST has been included on all food items, the issues of cooking attire and cleanliness will be monitored and dustbins will be provided adequately.

STATION:

FEEDBACK: 46% rated of students rated it as good, 32% as fair and 11% as very good. The survey stated that the behavior of staff is rude and food pricing is high.

POINTS NOTED: It was informed that GST has been included and profit margin is low, hence the pricing of food is nominal. The behavior of staff will be monitored.








STUDENT COUNCIL MEETING – I

AQUILAE 2.0: INTER-COLLEGIATE CULTURAL COMPETITION

Aquilae 2.0, the Annual Inter-Collegiate Cultural Competition of Stella Maris College was brought back after a gap of four years by the Students' Union 2018-19. The Competition was renamed as 'Aquilae 2.0' as opposed to the previous name 'Aquilae', the '2.0' signifying that the fest would be held on a bigger and better scale than ever before.

A total of eight colleges were invited for the Competition namely, MOP Vaishnav College for Women, Ethiraj College for Women, Women's Christian College, Loyola College, Madras Christian College, Guru Nanak College, Patrician College and Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women. The registration was restricted only to participants from the invited colleges.

There were totally four events conducted as part of the Aquilae 2.0. These were Group Dance, Group Music, Split Screen and Adzap. The event began with the Inauguration ceremony with a prayer by Vice Principal, Dr. Agnes Rozario and the event being declared open by Sr. Susan, Secretary of the college. The first event was Group Dance and it began with a host performance by the Western Dance Club (Theme team) depicting the theme of Cancer through their dance.

Having set a high benchmark for the participating teams, the Group dance event saw participants from Women's Christian College, Madras Christian College and Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women. The first place was bagged by Women's Christian College who presented their performance along the theme of Child Labour. The second and third places were bagged by Madras Christian College and Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women respectively. To mark the end of the Group Dance event, the Western Dance Club (non-theme) and Folk Dance Clubs of the college presented enthusiastic performances.

The next event in store was the Group Music event where a lot of colleges participated since two teams were allowed per college. These colleges included Patrician College, Women's Christian College, Ethiraj College for Women, Justice Basheer Ahmed Sayeed College for Women, Loyola College and Madras Christian






CLUB COUNCIL MEETING – II

SECOND STUDENT COUNCIL MEETING FOR THE SEMSTER ENDING MARCH 2019

FEEDBACK AND POINTS NOTED

INFRASTRUCTURE

LIBRARY

FEEDBACK: 20 % of the students rated the library as excellent, 49% as very good and 23% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestion stated was that pen drives should be permitted and the condition of the books should be inspected often by the staff. The students suggested that the students should be allowed to use books which has been issued and other study materials inside the library. An area for a study space was also suggested. The library stated that the suggestions were soon to be implemented in the coming year.

BANK

FEEDBACK: 8% of the students rated the bank as excellent, 33% as very good and 25% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The change in the ATM machine in the bank was appreciated.

VEHICLE PARKING

FEEDBACK: 4% of the students rated it as excellent, 33% as very good and 41% as good.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestions stated that vehicle charges were expensive and that an expansion of student vehicle parking was required. However, upon calculating the cost per day, it was seen to be minimal. Students were encouraged to park their vehicles responsibly.

WASHROOMS

FEEDBACK: 2% stated that the washrooms were in excellent condition, 8% as good and 36% as poor.

POINTS NOTED: Suggestions stated were the need of newspapers, installation of pegs, peddle dustbins and that the cleanliness of washrooms had to be maintained. Students were encouraged to bring their own newspapers and dispose the sanitary napkins responsibly. Washrooms for differently abled and provision for more restrooms would be provided.

DTP:

FEEDBACK: 43% students rated it as very good, 33% as good and 4% as excellent. The suggestions were that expansion of the DTP is required, books are not taken for photocopying, the color print outs are often unavailable.

POINTS NOTED:. The DTP stated that the DTP is always crowded and to expedite the process during exams, books are not taken for photocopying. The students are advised to have a check on their notes regularly. The issue of color print outs are resolved and the installation of computer virus fighter software are updated.

CANTEEN:

FEEDBACK: 47% of the students rated it as very good, 8% as fair and 16% as excellent. The feedbacks stated that the food pricing is high, infrastructure and cleanliness to be maintained, cooking attire to be worn and sufficient number of dustbins to be provided.

POINTS NOTED: Upon informing the canteen, it was reported that the GST has been included on all food items, the issues of cooking attire and cleanliness will be monitored and dustbins will be provided adequately.

STATION:

FEEDBACK: 16% rated of students rated it as good, 20% as fair and 16% as very good. The survey stated that the behavior of staff is rude and food pricing is high.

POINTS NOTED: It was informed that GST has been included and profit margin is low, hence the pricing of food is nominal. The behavior of staff will be monitored.

CULTURAL WEEK

FEEDBACK: The ratings for the new event, cultural week was the new initiative by the Students' Union. The cultural week has been rated by 43% students as excellent, and 35% students as very good, 14% as good and 10% as fair.

POINTS NOTED: Students appreciated the new initiative by the Students' Union 2018-19. The agenda behind this event was to appreciate the various cultural heritage of India. Cultural aspects of various states such as Kerala, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Punjab, Rajasthan and 7 sisters of North-East were celebrated.

DANDIYA NIGHT

FEEDBACK: The theme, Dandiya Night was very much liked by the students. The event was rated excellent by 49% of the student population, 39% rated it as very good and 12% as good. Suggestions for more number of entries were requested by the students.

POINT NOTED: The maximum number of entries were allowed to participate as per the OAT capacity, however the population exceeded 1500 students and further students were not allowed due to overcrowding.

INTER-YEAR

FEEDBACK: The theme for the interyears was 'Ready, Set and Explore'. The events conducted were themed around world travel and adventure. 18 % of the student population believed that the theme and events conducted were excellent and 25 % stated that it was very good. Suggestions were made to add new events and have been taken into consideration.

POINT NOTED: Suggestions were made to hold effective groupings, instead of the already prevalent ones and they will be taken into consideration for the next event. Students suggested the auditions conducted for events could be transparent which was noted that the auditions are conducted by the club office bearers or class or assistant representatives.

CHRSITMAS CELEBRATIONS

FEEDBACK: 45% of the students rated the Christmas celebrations to be 45%, 33% students rated very good and 10% rated good. The Christmas Carol competition, card making competition and Santa service was very much liked and appreciated by the students.

POINT NOTED: Further events and new initiatives for the upcoming years will be conducted.

ENTREPRENEURS DAY

FEEDBACK: 43% of the students rated excellent and 33% rated as very good and 14% students rated as good. The event met its agenda to encourage students play a major role in entrepreneurship skills.

POINT NOTED: Students were glad about the participation and opportunity provided to showcase their entrepreneurial skills.

AQUILAE 2.0

FEEDBACK: The annual intercollegiate cultural fest, Aquilae 2.0 was hosted by the Students' Union 2018-19 after 3 years. 23 % of the student population believed that the theme and events conducted were excellent,16 % stated that it was very good and 27% rated good. Suggestions were made to add new events, invite more colleges.

POINT NOTED: Aquilae 2.0 was the intercollegiate event held after 3 years hence to start off, 8 colleges and 4 events were conducted. More events and colleges have been taken into consideration and would employed for years to come. Students were extremely joyful about the event. The event was a grand success.

NEON NIGHT

FEEDBACK: 67% rated the event as excellent, 25% stated that the event to be very good. The theme Neon Night was loved by all the students and the suggestions were to increase the number of entries and extend the duration of the event.

POINT NOTED: The suggestions were taken into consideration however the maximum number of entries were allowed and the duration of the event could not be changed as the curfew timings were strictly informed.

HORIZON

FEEDBACK: The overall Horizon event was rated as 20% excellent by the students, 33% very good and 39% as good. The horizon workshops were rated as 16% excellent, 43% very good and 25% good. The participation and satisfaction for overall event was rated as 20% and 41% good.

POINT NOTED: No suggestions or comments were noted.

CLUB ACTIVITIES

FEEDBACK: The ratings for the club activities have improved since this year, with the initiative of the Students' Union of Clubs week and Youth Skills Program. The activeness of the club has been rated by 33% students as good, and 33% students as very good. The effectiveness in circulating club related information has been rated by 38% of students as very good and 28% students as excellent. The satisfaction in how the auditions and elections were conducted has been rated as excellent by 18% of students, very good by 37% students and good by 27% students.

POINTS NOTED: The suggestions and developments which the students' union enforced to make the club activities more effective include the Clubs Week initiative, Youth Skills Program. Clubs week initiative provided a platform for non-performing clubs to conduct various activities and competitions. The Students' Union started the YSP. YSP mainly aimed at the performing clubs, where the office bearers or members of the club conducted classes for the students at a minimal fee and at the end a certificate was awarded to them. The suggestions were that the certificates weren't given on time and spamming of the groups to be avoided and these were taken into consideration.

STUDENTS' UNION 2018-19

FEEDBACK: To the feedback questionnaire if the students' union is consistently upholding the theme Ignite 33% of the students rated as excellent, 35% as very good and 28% rated as good. 47% students believed that the students' union approachability as excellent, 22% very good and 25% rated as good. For the feedback questionnaire has the Students' Union 2018-19 promoted inclusiveness, empowerment and active participation in all activities, 47% students rated as excellent and 31% as very good and 16% as good.

POINT NEEDED: The overall satisfaction and approachability of Students' Union 2018-19 was well treasured by the students and staff.

CLUBS REPORT

CLUB ACTIVITIES- ACADEMIC YEAR 2018-19

The clubs have been an important part of the Students' Union 18-19 activities and this year, the clubs were focused on being active and promote inclusiveness among the students. The following are the activities conducted by the clubs this academic year.

Classical Dance Club:

The goal of the Classical Dance Club for the year 2018-19 has been to lay emphasis on the multiplicity of Indian Classical dance forms, provide a platform for the students to familiarize with classical dance forms apart from Bharatanatyam, to come up with choreographies by the aspiring student choreographers fusing the myriad dance forms and music from different parts of the country and adding innovative elements to it while adhering to idea of classicism. The Club's performances this year, in and outside college, were not just limited to Bharatanatyam but styles including Mohiniyattam, Kathakali, Kuchipudi and Odissi.

Some of the notable events where the Classical Dance Club showcased their performances include the Freshers' Welcome day, Teachers' Day, Foundress Day, Christmas Celebrations, Aquilae 2.0 (Inter-collegiate Culural Competition) Horizon (Club Day) and College Day where they depicted different classical dance styles with themes.

The Classical Dance Club was selected in the Inter- College auditions for the Republic day programme organised by the Government of Tamil Nadu. After almost a month of intense rehearsals, the team in collaboration with the Folk Dance Club performed on 26th January 2019 at the Marina for the programme presided by the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu and the Governor. The dancers received the third place and special mention for their performance.

Apart from within college events, the club has also actively taken part in Inter-Collegiate competitions. The Club came Second at MCC's Aurora 2018, at the LIBA Fest, Loyola College and at Womens' Christian College Inter-College Cultural Fest. The members of the club have also performed at various sabhas in

Chennai, Tirupathi, Hyderabad, Trissur, Tiruppur and Bengaluru during the Margazhi festival in the month of December.

This academic year of 2018-19 saw the Classical Dance Club bag the 'Best Club Award' on the Annual Union Day celebrations held on March 23, 2019. The office bearers were presented with the rolling trophy by the Principal.

Enviro and Paw Pals Club:

The main aim of the Enviro and Paw Pals club has been towards conserving the biodiversity and promoting ecological peace not only within the college campus but also in our society. A club workshop on sustainable environmental practices and future endeavors was conducted on 23 July 2018 which was followed by the plastic- free campus initiative in the month of August and the World Beach Cleanup- Chennai in September. The activities of the clubs week, a new initiative by the Students' Union were also conducted in November 2018.

The events for the second semester began with the making of laminated sheets that would be used to label the dustbins in college to facilitate waste segregation. Cardboard posters with various slogans promoting the disuse of plastic were tied to the trees on campus during the college Christmas fête to promote eco-friendly practices on campus.

A few of the members participated in the 'Friends of Chennai' wall painting initiative at the Kodambakkam sewage treatment plant in December 2018. Apart from these, the usual activities of the Enviro Club include docent work at the Madras Crocodile Bank Trust, and volunteering at Blue Cross, Chennai.

Debate, Quiz and Current Affairs Club:

With 200 registrations in the beginning of the year, the debate club saw active participation across all fronts throughout the year.

The club conducted the National Level Quiz - SMC Quiz IV on 16 November, 2018. The quiz was hosted by the nationally recognized quizmaster, Major Chandrakanth Nair and an alumna of Stella Maris College, Rumaiza Fathima. It garnered participation from students all across the country and IIT Madras bagged the first place. To keep up and engage the students with quizzing, the club conducted the QF1 League in association with the Quiz Foundation of India. The QF1 quiz was a fortnightly quiz conducted within the campus, seeing significant participation from students from all disciplines, with the numbers increasing in each round.

On the debating front, the club saw enthusiastic participation and hence two workshops were conducted for students to hone their debating skills and abilities. The first workshop was an MUN 101 by Ayush R, a reputed MUNner in the Chennai circuit. The workshop provisioned basic briefing about the procedure of an MUN and further equipped students with the ability to enhance their speaking skill. The second workshop by the club, as a part of the club day (HORIZON), was a Debate 101 by Sidhaanth KD, Co-founder and CEO of Warhorse. The workshop was aimed at engaging with the newer debaters and allow for provisioning a theoretical understanding to debating. The workshop saw a good number of participants, who learnt the fundamentals of case building and argumentation.

Various interesting events like Just A Minute, quiz, shipwreck, etc., were conducted during the Club's Week in the month of November. The club has collaborated with the various departments and clubs of Stella Maris College in organizing events throughout the academic year.

The club's final event for the year was The SMCPD 7. It was the seventh edition of the Parliamentary Debate and the tournament had caught the attention of the national debating circuit. This year, students from Mumbai, Pune, Bangalore and Kochi were seen participating in the SMCPD 7.

Some of the notable achievements and participation were seen in inter-collegiate events like, SRM Arush, RV Debate Tournament- Bengaluru, NALSAR Inter Varsity Debate Tournament- Hyderabad, SRM Vadapalani Model United Nations, VITness Leadership Summit, SRM Ramapuram Model United Nations, SSN Model United Nations, Loyola Equilibrium, SOELMUN, NMBMUN, IITMMUN, IIT Saraang Debate, SSN Instincts debate, Sweden India Nobel memorial quiz, WCC - Quiz, WCC Festive Debate, MCC General Quiz and also within college events in collaboration with the Students' Union and the various departments.

Mime and Street Theatre Club:

A workshop was conducted on August 2, 2018 by Mr. Naresh, a renowned mime and street theatre artist to orient the members about the basic elements of mime. The Mime Club has also participated in various events within college and at intercollege culutual competitions.

Performances within college included the Freshers' Welcome day, Teachers' Day, and Horizon (Club day). The members of the Mime Club also paticipated in intercollege competiotions like AURORA conducted by Madras Christian College on 24 Sepetember, 2018 and DEEPWOODS conducted by Madras Christian College on 14 February, 2019.

The Mime Club performed at the National seminar on Media by Sacred Heart College on 7 & 8 November 2018. The members also volunteered and organized "Youth symposium to end child marriage" in collaboration with UNICEF at Stella Maris College.

Western Dance Club:

The Western Dance Club since the previous academic year has been divided into the "Theme team" and the "Non- theme team". The Non- theme team continued with the same choreographer from last year, Mr. Anwer Shariff and the Theme team worked under Mr. Jagadish Kumar from whom theye learnt dance styles like Afro, Contemporary, Jazz and Ballet to mention a few. The theme for the Theme team's performances this academic year was Cancer and its awareness.

The Western Dance Club has performed at various college events like Freshers' Welcome, Teachers' Day, Friendship Day, Christmas Celebrations, Aquilae 2.0 (Inter- Collegiate Cultural Competition), Horizon (Club day) and College Day. In addition to these performances, the Western Dance Club has brought a number of awards and recognitions to the college through their participation in various Inter-Collegiate Cultural Competitions.

The Non-theme team participated in cultural competitions conducted by colleges like IIT Saarang, Ethiraj College for Women, Womens' Christian College, Madras Christian College and won the second and third place at Techofes by Anna University and NIFT respectively.

The Theme team participated in competitions held at Patrician College of Arts and Science, Madras Christian College, Techofes by Anna University and won the first prize at competitions conducted by Womens' Christian College, SRM University's cultural competition- Milan and Chennai Institute of Teachnology.

Damini Club:

The Damini club was focussed on conducting activities to ameliorate existing societal perceptions towards women and create an increased awareness regarding issues faced by women. Eminent speakers were also invited to engage with students and explore a variety of relevant topics. The first activity that was conducted by the Damini club as a part of UBCHEA program in collaboration with the Department of History and Tourism was a one day trip to Kanchipuram on 29 June 2018. The trip comprised of a visit to the Kanchipuram museum called Kanchi Kudil, followed by a session on women empowerment with an NGO called RIDE- Rural Institute for Development Education in which more than 45 students participated.

On 31 July 2018, the club conducted a workshop on the topic 'What Women Do?' guided by Dr. Swarna Rajagopalan, a writer, political analyst and a social entrepreneur who is the founding trustee of 'The Prajnya trust'. There was also a presentation by Dr. Swarna on "Gender Differences" in which she spoke on different parts in society where women are invisible and treated unequally. She touched upon a few sensitive issues and myths that are against women which invited an interactive session with the club members.

The club conducted a workshop on 'Gender and Theatre in India' guided by Dr. V Padma, a retired English professor from Stella Maris College on 2 August 2018. The resource person mentioned the 'LGBT' community and the problems they face in society. The students were also briefed on the stereotypical gender roles on how men and women are expected to perform only specific roles by society and as the future generation, the steps which can be taken to change these perceptions and break the taboo.

Damini club week, an initiative by the Studens' Union 2018-19 was held from 6 to 13 September 2018 when various competitions such as poetry, essay writing and photography competitions were conducted. The topics were 'Women of the 21st Century' for the poetry and essay competitions. The topic for the photography competition was 'Woman's role in environment protection'. Around 40 students participated in the events and the week was a few break- time ranting sessions on the LGBTQ rights and Section 377 were also conducted.

A symposium was held on November 28, 2018 by the Prajnya society in collaboration with the Damini Club on various work issues and difficulties faced by women in informal work sectors where around 25 students from the club participated in the discussion and presented papers. The motive of this symposium was to support women who work in the unorganized sectors and to throw light on the day- to- day issues faced at work. Around 30 workers from the unorganised sector were invited to the event to share their life stories with the students.

The club launched a new initiative called "Women in unusual profession" where auto drivers, cremators and women barbers were invited to interact with the students and share their life experiences. As a part of the Horizon (Club day) the club organized a self-defence workshop where Mr. Shihan S. Haribabu who had trained under renowned masters in Italy, USA and Japan helped students learn a few kicks and punches. He also explained the easy methods of self-defence and safety that students can follow while travelling on public transport.

The FASA training workshop a rural outreach program on child and women's education was initiated by the club where eligible students after few training sessions will be selected to teach school children on Women's rights, responsibility of a man towards a woman and the society, social evils and precautions to safeguard themselves from it. Around 150 students from both the shifts have registered for the training sessions which will commence from the next academic year.

The club frequently conducted ranting sessions after the college hours where students shared their opinions and views on current issues faced by women in India and across the world. The Damini club's final event for the year was organising the International Women's Day celebrations in collaboration with the Centre for Women's Studies, Stella Maris College.

Event Management Club:

The Event Management Club had over 450 students registering under various committees this academic year. All through the year, the members of the club in collaboration with the Students' Union helped with crowd control for the events held in college. A few of these events include, Freshers' Talent Hunt, Inter-year Cultural Competition, Christmas Celebrations, Horizon (Club day), Aquilae 2.0 etc.,

A major development this year for the Event Management Club has been the introduction of red caps for the volunteers involved in crowd control. This was done to facilitate easy identification of volunteers. Volunteers and event heads for competitions were also given tags and badges for identification purposes. Volunteers were assigned at different locations in college to ensure maximum participation in events like the main gates, for the various blocks in college and also for classrooms.

The Event Management Club has assisted the Students' Union with preparing handmade backdrops for various events like Freshers' Talent Hunt, Inter-year Cultural Competition, Christmas Celebrations, Union Day etc.,. In addition to this, the volunteers also helped with preparing décor in the Open Air Theatre in accordance with the theme of the event. The Event Management Club has also assisted the Union with minor activities like coordination and making posters for break-time events.

Dramatics Club:

The Dramatics Club, also known as 'The Stella Players' has been an extremely active club this academic year. The club had registered a total of 300 members at the beginning of the year and they were divided into different groups including, Sponsorship, Acting, Scriptwriting, Art and Design and Production. Ice- breaker sessions were held periodically to provide an insight for students into what is expected of them in the club.

The Stella Players in collaboration with the Students' Union presented a short play on the International Day against Drug Abuse during the break time which received a lot of appreciation. The Script Writing Competition was announced on 12 July 2018 and the writers were given a weeks' time to submit their entries. A total of 17 scripts were submitted and the top 3 were selected as the winning scripts.

The first acting workshop was conducted on 26 July 2018 by Mr. Krishnakumar Balasubramanian and Ms. Ananya, both famous theatre artists from 'The Little Theatre'. (Theatre Group). The main activities in the workshop included games which helped in Inhibition breaking, Rhythm developing, making eye contact, understanding the Concept of Sub texts and story developing through freeze frames. The second workshop for the year was conducted by an alumna of the college, Ms. Kavya Ramachandran on 3 August 2018. This workshop mainly focused on the different Theatre aspects such as physical movements, voice modulation, voice strength and emotions.

The Dramatics Club has done exceedingly well even at Inter- Collegiate Cultural Competitions. Some of the notable achievements include the following: IITM- Saarang 2019- The Dramatics Club participated in the Improv Competition conducted by IIT and was place runner up and won a cash prize of Rs. 3000.

Madras Christian College- 'Deepwoods' 2019- The Stella Players performed a comedy play titled 'Lunch at Shivani's' and was placed first for the same. The team of 7 won a cash prize of Rs. 7000. The members of the club also won awards in events like Monologue and Spin a yarn.

SSN College conducted its second annual theatre fest called 'Theatricals ACT 2.' One of the winning scripts from the script writing competition was taken and

performed for this competition. A total of 12 girls acted in this play and the Stella Players got special mention for costume and props for this competition.

'Theatricals' Stella's annual theatre fest conducted in collaboration with Evam where colleges from all over Tamil Nadu are invited to showcase their talent in theatre took place on 23 September 2018 in college and the finals took place on 7 October 2018 in Alliance Francaise. A total of 5 teams from different city colleges took part in the event and SSN college emerged as a winner, receiving a cash prize of rupees 10,000. The Stella Players, in collaboration with Western Music Club staged the 'Master and a Piece', as the host performance. Overall, the event was a success, with over 300 tickets sold for two shows.

The Dramatics Club has also performed for other in-college events like Christmas Celebrations, Horizon (Club Day) and International Women's Day. The final workshop was conducted by Mr. V. Balakrishnan, the founder and artistic director of Theatre 'Nisha' and Shakti from Theatre Nisha conducted a Physical Movement workshop on the 5th of March as part of Horizon (Club Day). The workshop consisted of several aspects of body movement and moving in accordance to a concept or a beat.

The Annual College Play titled 'ON BOTH SIDES' was brought back after a period of four years and it received huge appreciation from all students. Scriptwriting for the College Play began in the month of August where a group of students under the guidance of the faculty advisor of the club, came up with an exclusive idea. The play was about 7 characters from the Bengali writer, Mahaswetha Devi's books meeting real life contemporary characters.

Auditions were conducted and the selected student cast and crew started rehearsals thrice a week from the month of October under the able guidance of Dr. Mangai (former faculty) and her team. The Set design, prop design, costumes and makeup was approved and tickets were priced at Rs.150 for students and Rs. 250 and Rs. 500 for others. The play was staged on 22nd, 23rd, 24th of February in room F21 with a total of five shows which was open to the public. The College Play featured in 'The Hindu' and 'The Times of India' and tickets were also available on 'Book My Show'. With a seating capacity of 400, almost all the 5 shows were a full house. The Stella Players received a standing ovation for 3 shows. There were

several esteemed guests and theatre professionals amidst the crowd from whom the club received a lot of acclaim.

Western Music Club:

The Western Music Club has taken part in various activities through the year, including competitions and collaborations. The club from this academic year constitutes an exclusive Acapella group, as well as an Acoustic group. A workshop for those who registered to be a part of the club was conducted by the office bearers on the 1st of August 2018. Topics like music theory, vocal exercises, stage presence and other techniques were covered in the workshop. Open Mic Auditions were held shortly after the workshop was conducted and many students from both the shifts who registered participated in the auditions. According to the talent that the students had showcased, students were selected to be part of either the Acapella team or the Acoustic team.

The Acapella group of the Western Music Club, known as Acastella has performed alongside many others as part of a Madras Musical Association initiative called 'Carols By Candlelight' on the 22nd of December 2018, on account of celebrating Christmas. Acastella secured the second place in the Acapella event, hosted by IIT during their annual cultural fest, on the 11th of January. The Acoustic group of the WMC participated in the 'Acoustics and Unplugged' event hosted by the same, on the 12th of January. Acastella participated in Festeve (Women's Christian College Cultural Competition). Acastella as well as the Acoustic group participated in the 'Acoustics and Acapella' event conducted MCC, and Acastella secured the first place.

On October 7th 2018, the Western Music Club in collaboration with the Dramatics club put together the host performance for 'Theatricles'. The play titled"The Master and The Piece" had two musical numbers in it, both composed and performed by members of the Western Music Club. The WMC in collaboration with Stellaidoscope, hosted an Inter-Collegiate Open Mic on the 12th of February 2019. This event comprised of three events, namely Music, Stand-Up Comedy as well as Slam Poetry. It was a successful event and many talented participants from the invited colleges registered to take part in the event.

Stellaeidoscope:

The new academic year brought out a host of pleasant changes in Stellaeidoscope. These new changes started with the introduction of two new office bearers, Secretary Shift 1 and Secretary Shift 2, in addition to the existing Editor and Assistant Editor. The first workshop was a creative writing workshop, conducted by Ms. Sayujya Sankar from the Department of English, Stella Maris College. The Students' Union brought out a new initiative by devoting an entire week for a club. This initiative enabled the members to showcase their skills during poetry recitals, singing talents during the karaoke session and talking about their favourite books and movies with other students.

Stellaeidoscope released new issues almost every month this academic year. The first issue came out in July 2018 with the theme 'LGBTQ+ Pride'. The second issue came out in August 2018 with the theme 'Throwback'. October's issue had the theme as 'Fandoms' which created a lot of excitement amongst the students and readers, alike. In December, the next issue was published and dealt with an unconventional theme for that time of the year – 'Humour'.

Three new features were also introduced this time: Comic Strip, Stella in Pixels and News in Bite Size. The purpose of the comic strip was to bring out the experience of being a Stella Marian in a light-hearted manner. The feature Stella in Pixels is a collection of candid photos of the College, which is unique in its own way. News in Bite Size was introduced to keep the readership aware of the current happenings around the country and the world.

Stellaeidoscope conducted the first ever inter-collegiate open- mic in collaboration with the Western Music Club on February 12 2019. Fifteen colleges from across the city had been invited and there were around thirty participants in total. A registration fee of Rs. 50 was collected from them. Prominent people like Guru Nicketan, Vasanthi Swetha (alumnae of Stella Maris College), Sidharth Nair and Namitha Anand were invited to judge stand-up comedy, slam poetry and music, respectively. Organising this event gave an opportunity to understand the open-mic circuit in the city.

Light Music Club:

The Light Music Club has actively participated in all the in-college programs including Fresher's Welcome, Independence Day, Teacher's Day, Christmas Celebrations, Horizon (Club Day), Aquilae 2.0 (Inter-collegiate Cultural Competiton), Non-teaching Staff Day, International Women's Day and College Day. The Light Music Club also performed for break-time events like Friendship Day and 150th Gandhi Jayanthi Celebrations.

The club saw a registration of around 170 students this year. The first ever workshop was conducted by an esteemed resource person, Mr. Ananth Vaidhyanathan, a leading voice expert. This workshop saw participation from almost around 160 students who had registered. Following the workshop, auditions were conducted for students and new members were enrolled into the club.

Most of the songs of the club were sung in the fusion format after rigorous practice. The Light Music Club participated in the Women's Christian College-Festeve Inter- Collegiate Cultural Competition and qualified for the finals. The Light Music Club as the final activity for the year re-recorded the Tamil version of the Stella Maris College Song at a recording studio under the able guidance of the Vice Principals and the faculty advisor. This version will be released from the next academic year and will be played every alternate Monday.

Photography Club:

The photography club has always worked in close coordination with the Students' Union and have covered events ranging from Fresher's Talent Hunt, Inter-Year Cultural Competition, Aquilae 2.0, Christmas Celebrations, Teacher's Day, Horizon (Club Day), Union day etc.

The club has organized various workshops to broaden the knowledge of photography among students. The first workshop for the academic year was conducted on the 14th of July, 2018 by Mr. Rakesh Pulapa (A professional Photographer who's won numerous awards for his excellence, also well recognized by Nat Geo). The workshop was a success with more than 50 participants attending the workshop. The next workshop was conducted by a Professional travel and portrait photographer Mr. Jeshuran GJ. More than 250 students participated in this workshop which focused on the framing and editing aspects of photography.

The Photography Week was another successful event conducted by the club as part of the initiative introduced by the Students' Union. Mobile photographers and DSLR users were given the opportunity to compete with each other and the best photographer was awarded to encourage the photography skills in them. The Photography Club conducted the 'Photo Walk' in which 15 students accompanied the office bearers to Marina beach to click photos. A small meeting amongst the club members was conducted to enhance the knowledge of photography through discussions.

As part of Horizon (Club Day) 5th of March, 2019, the club held a workshop for which an International Wildlife Photographer, Ms. Radhika Ramaswamy (employee of Nat Geo who takes up minor projects) was invited. She gave an overall view on Photography beginning from the basics of a DSLR to the techniques used in wildlife photography.

The Photography Club members have won accolades like the 'Best Photographer Award' at MUNs organised by other colleges. Some of the members have their pictures being featured on different online photography pages like 'Nature Photography India' page and 'Mobile Clicks India' page. The members are constantly focussed towards achieving great heights in the Photography spectrum and aim to improvise their skills in the field.

Folk Dance Club:

The Folk Dance Club had an eventful year with their first event being Fresher's Welcome in which they performed a traditional folk dance form. The club conducted a workshop for the new members who had joined the club with their resource person, Mr. Seenu (Choreographer and Dance master) following which auditions were conducted.

The Folk Dance Club performed for events like Independence Day, Teacher's Day, Alumnae Association's Christmas Celebrations, Pongal Celebrations, Horizon (Club day), College Day and depicted different styles of Folk Dance. The club has participated in various Inter- Collegiate Cultural Dance Competitions and they won the second place at ICAT- Design and Media College Cultural Competition (Miraki).

After almost a month of intense rehearsals , the team in collaboration with the Classical Dance Club performed on 26th January 2019 at the Marina for the programme presided by the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu and the Governor.
